The Ballad Health Tusculum University Clinic, located in Room 008 of the Meen Center, now has the flu vaccine for this season.

Anyone who is interested in receiving a flu vaccination is welcome to visit the clinic during normal operating hours. Those are Mondays and Wednesdays from 8-11:30 a.m. and Thursdays from 1-3:30 p.m. Vaccination is your best protection against contracting the flu.

No appointment is necessary. Patients can self-pay or use their health insurance. Students can apply for payment aid, if necessary.

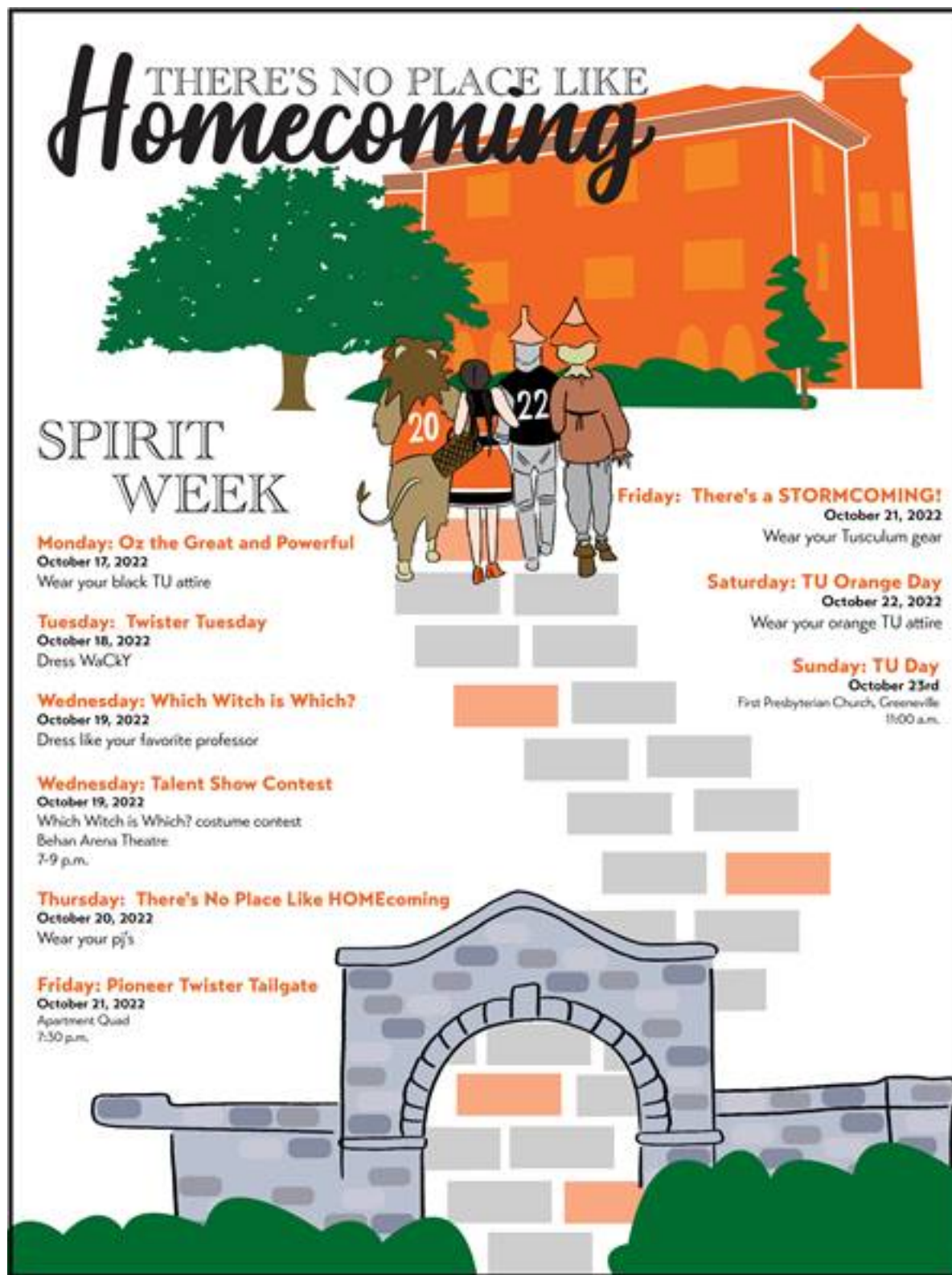

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Helping students in need

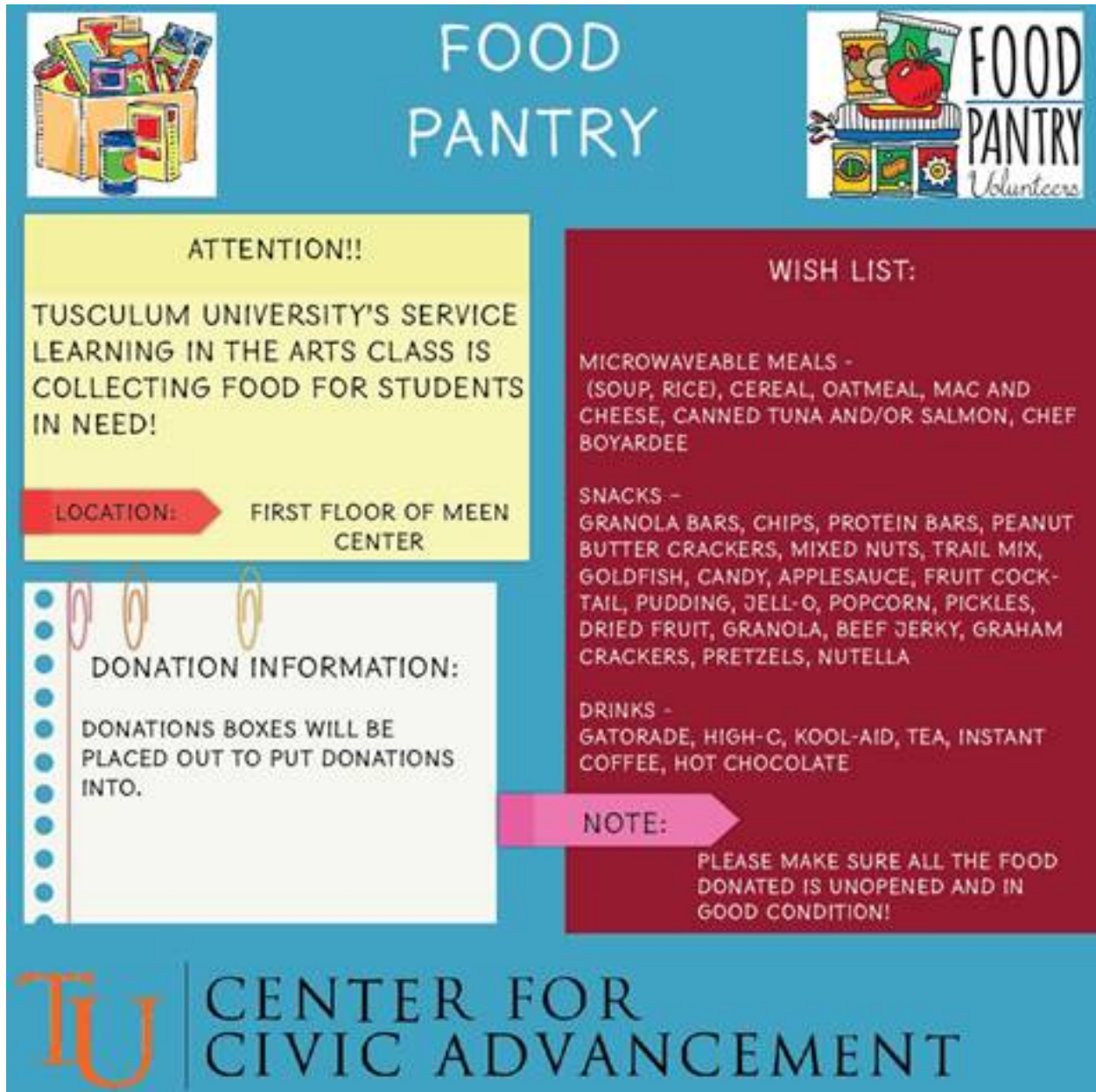
The Service Learning in the Arts class has organized a food drive to support students in need and is providing a couple of methods in which Tusculum family members and the community can assist.

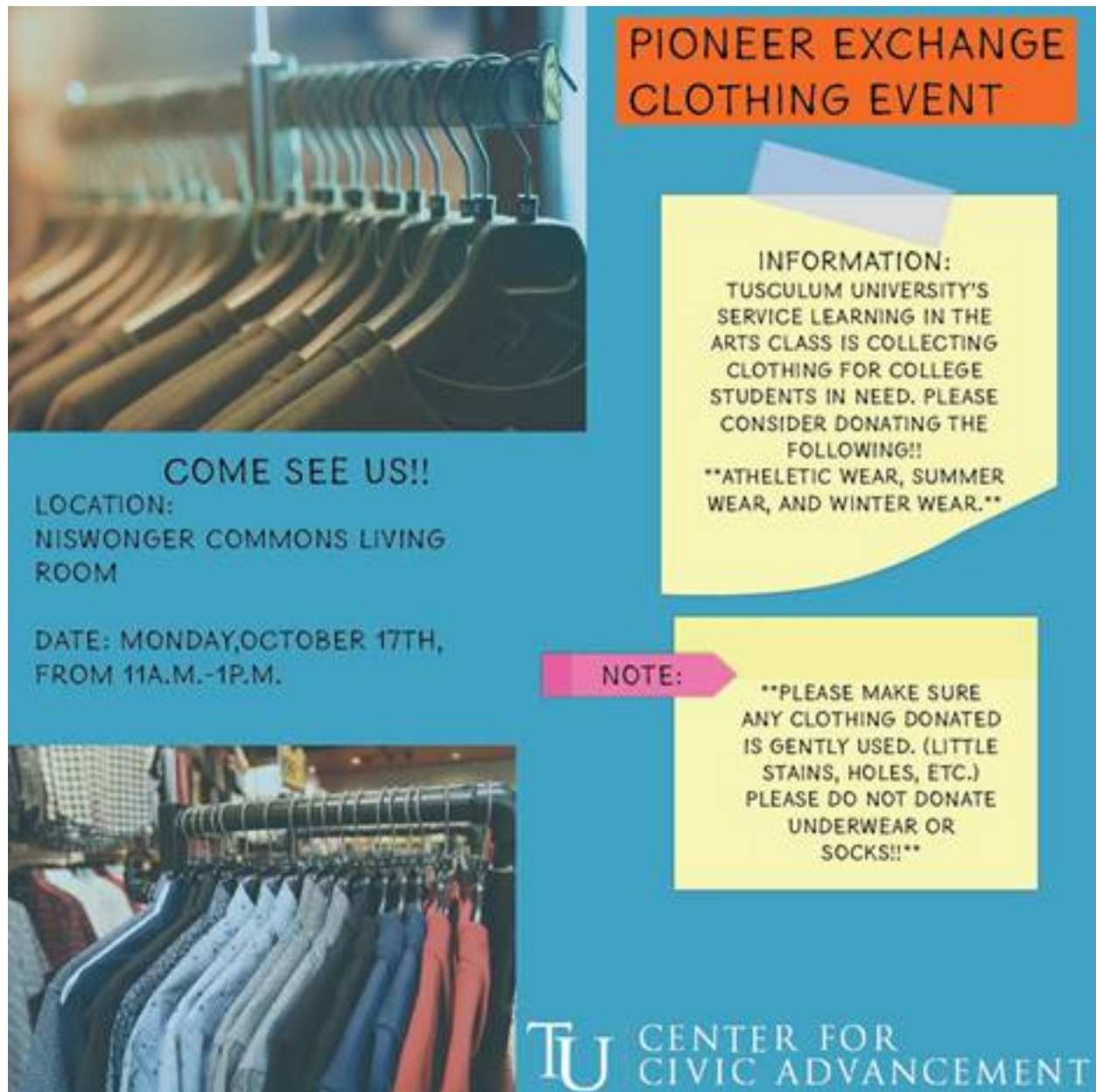

Faculty and staff can secure a Sam's Club membership

A representative of Sam's Club will be in front of the Office of Student Affairs Friday, Oct. 14, from 10 a.m.-3 p.m. for employees and students who are interested in becoming a member.

The offer for employees is for a club membership for \$19.99 and \$30 off the first in-club purchase of \$30 or more. This essentially makes the membership free. This offer is for teachers, professors, educators, administrators and any employee in the education system.

Students can purchase a membership for \$45, with \$10 off their first purchase of \$20 or more. They have 60 days to use that discount. They are also eligible for the Plus membership, which costs \$100. They receive \$50 off their first purchase of \$50 or more and have 60 days to collect that discount.

The only catch is that memberships must be established in person or the offers will not work. All that is required is for individuals to scan the QR code the Sam's representative will have and they create the membership on their phone.
