

Catalog several times. Her theatrical background begins at a young age, as her brother, Rick Marshall, was the theatre instructor at Dobyns-Bennett High School when she was a child.

Serina went on to be a part of several productions on stage and backstage, including "And they Dance Real Slow in Jackson," "Our Town" and "Noises Off," but found her real love in music directing, and was even nominated for a Broadway World Orlando Award for music direction of "The Producers" at Osceola Arts in 2016.

In the Fall of 1967, a young man from Pennsylvania set foot on the Tusculum (College) University campus. This turned out to be a life-changing experience.

Marwood "Woody" Meredith '71 has often said, "I came to Tusculum a 17-year-old boy and graduated a 21-year-old man heading to seminary. It was on that campus that I grew up and laid the foundation for my calling

as a minister in the Presbyterian Church (USA)". Forty-eight years later that foundation has served him well and is as strong as ever. Upon graduating from TU in 1971 Woody went on to Pittsburgh Theological Seminary where he graduated with a Master of Divinity Degree and completed the course work for a Doctor of Ministry Degree. Over the next twenty years he served two churches in the Philadelphia area, one in Northeast Philadelphia for five years and one in Ridley Park, PA as Senior Pastor for fifteen years.

Woody then found himself back on the Tusculum campus serving as Director of Planned Giving and Church Relations for the next five years. He then went back to Pittsburgh Theological Seminary as Vice President of Development, followed by serving in the same capacity at Brite Divinity School on the campus of Texas Christian University in Fort Worth, Texas.

Woody has served as a member of or chaired numerous committees at all levels of the Presbyterian Church from Presbytery to the General Assembly. He is currently serving as the pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Athens, TX and is President of the Board of the Athens Christian Preparatory Academy, a position he has held for seven years.

"Tusculum set the stage and provided the necessary education for a lifetime of service in the Church and the communities in which I have lived. There is not a day that goes by that I don't thank God for my time of the campus of Tusculum (College) University."

Tusculum University is so grateful for Woody and his continued engagement and financial support

of his beloved alma mater. We are so proud of his accomplishments and believe he is wonderful example of an alumnus who continues to live out the mission of Tusculum University.

The presentations, held on Fridays, will last about two hours, after which attendees are invited for lunch in the cafeteria.




Tusculum wins first SAC Tournament Championship in program history
